A motion was made by Councilor Theulen and seconded by Councilor Meister approving the consent agenda including agenda, minutes from the September 12th 2022 council meeting, minutes from the September 19th special city council meeting, approval of claims, Sheriff's report, approval of Al's Corner Oil Co. DBA Sparky's one Stop Class C Beer permit renewal, approval of Library Board of Trustee Pam Hospelhorn for a six year term, and payroll. The motion was duly put to a vote of the Council. 2022-2023 IOWA HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM ATTENTION: RESIDENTIAL CUSTOMERS NEED HELP WITH YOUR HEATING BILL?

WHEN TO APPLY:

Elderly (60 & over) and/or disabled:

October 1, 2022 to April 30, 2023

All other households:

November 1, 2022 to April 30, 2023

WHAT TO TAKE:

Proof of Income (for all household members age 19 and over) Depending upon your household income type, income documentation from the past 30 days, the last 12 months, or last calendar year, whichever is easier or more beneficial for you.

Proof of Social Security Numbers for all household members (documentation required) **Most recent heat bill, Most recent electric bill**

WAGE EARNERS:

Please bring copies of your check stubs for the 30-day period preceding the date of application, or a copy of your most recent federal income tax return.

FIXED INCOME:

This income may include: Social Security Benefits, Supplemental Security Income, Family Investment Program, Veteran's Assistance, Unemployment Insurance, and pensions. Please bring copies of your check stubs from the previous 30 days.

SELF-EMPLOYED/FARMERS:

Please bring a copy of your most recent federal income tax return.

FIP RECIPIENTS:

Please bring your current DHS Notice of Decision or contact your local office for acceptable document information.

If you receive alimony or child support, it will also need to be verified. Additional income not listed here may be required.
